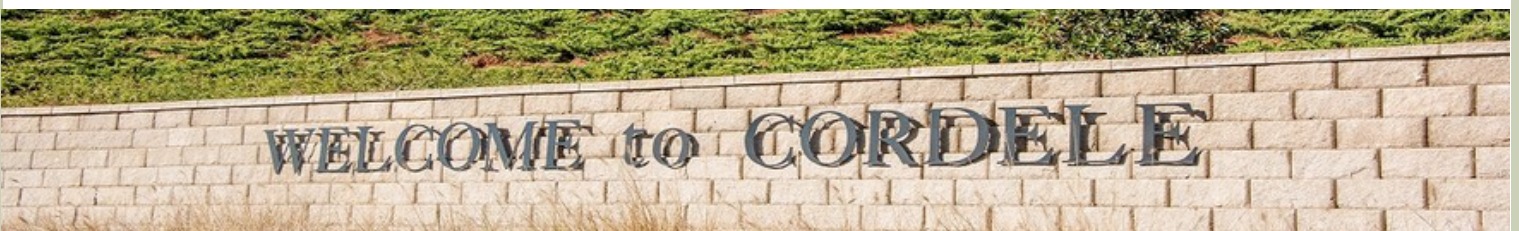

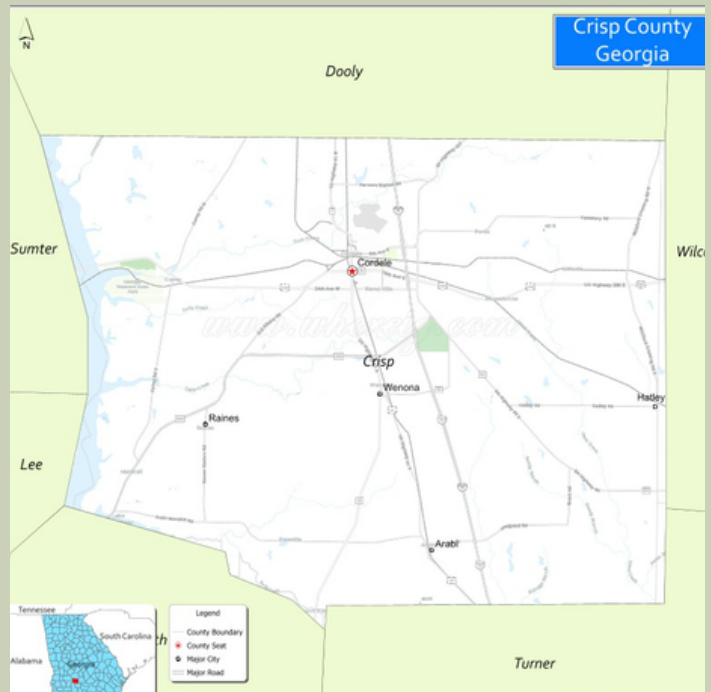

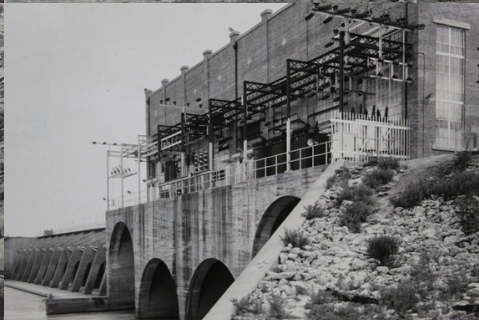

CRISP COUNTY

HISTORY

Origin: The area now forming Crisp County was once a province called Chisi, Ichisi, or Achese, which was inhabited by the Lower Creek division of the Muskogee Indians. The first Europeans visited the area in 1540, when Spanish explorer Hernando de Soto and his followers passed through. Priests traveling with the explorers said Mass in a village that historians have identified as a predecessor of the modern town of Cordele. This Mass may have been the first Christian religious service held in the southeastern United States. In an effort to curtail English trade with Creeks in the region, Spanish Floridians allied with Apalachee Indians and attacked the English and Creeks in 1702. The English and Creeks prevailed against the invaders near the Flint River in what is now Crisp County, and the battle marked the opening of a campaign that led to England's successful bid for control of the Mississippi Valley. The Crisp County Courthouse coming of railroad transportation to the area in the 1880s had a significant impact on population patterns. Several towns were formed at the sites where one or several of the railroads made stops. Among these was Arabi, founded in 1888 and incorporated in 1891. Cordele, founded in 1888 by John Edgar Dawson Shipp of Americus and incorporated that same year, was named for a daughter of Samuel H. Hawkins, president of the Savannah, Americus, and Montgomery Railroad. The town was known in its early years as "the Hub City" because it stood at the junction of several railroad lines. In November 1864, during the Civil War (1861- 65), Joseph E. Brown, the Georgia governor, fled to his farmhouse near Cordele to avoid Union general William T. Sherman's troops, and for a few days Cordele served as the temporary capital of Confederate Georgia. In 1987 Cordele was named a "Main Street City," becoming part of a nationwide program aimed at revitalizing downtowns. Other unincorporated communities in the county are Hatley, Raines, and Wenona.

Board of Commissioners:

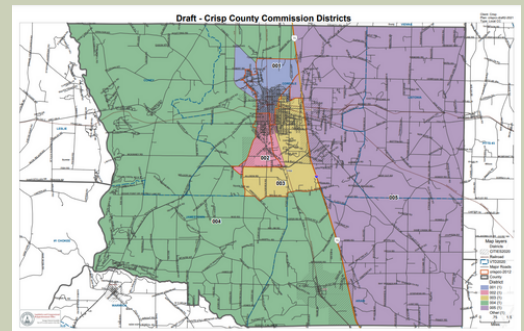
Structure: Crisp County is governed by a board of five commissioners elected from five separate districts.

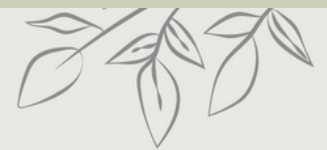

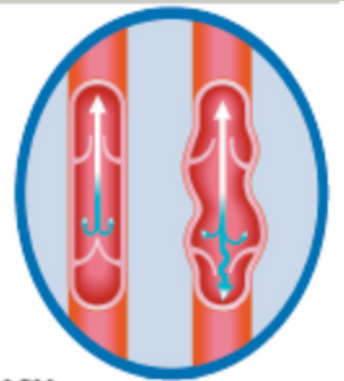

DOOLY COUNTY

HISTORY

Dooly County, the 48th county formed in Georgia, was created in 1821. It was one of the original land lot counties and was later divided to make Crisp and parts of Macon, Pulaski, Turner, Wilcox, and Worth counties.

The county was named for Colonel John Dooly, a Revolutionary War hero who helped prosecute Tories in 1779 and was murdered by them the following year. Vienna (pronounced vye«-enna locally), the county seat, was named after the capital of Austria.

Historic sites in the county include the Dooly County Courthouse. It was built in 1891 of granite, slate, and brick and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Dooly Campground, which was built in 1875, is an open-air tabernacle constructed with hand-hewn timbers that still hosts many community activities.

Communities in Dooly County include Byromville, Dooling, Lilly, Pinehurst, Unadilla, and Vienna.



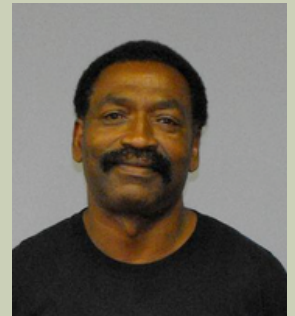

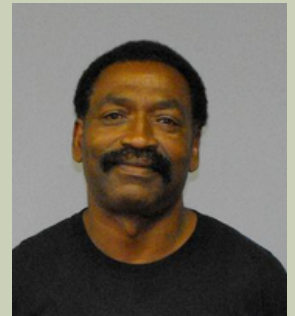

The land, approximately 202.5 acres was originally granted by the State of Georgia to John Williams, Jr. on January 1, 1824. On January 23 that same year Williams sold it to John Adams. Adams sold the land to N. Thomas Swearington on January 6, 1829. Swearington built a house and dug a well which become a stagecoach stop for getting water and watering the horses. On November 23, 1852, Swearington sold the land to William H. Byrom, the founder of Byromville. In 1859 Byrom built the Byrom House. On July 1, 1853, the post office of Byromville opened with William Byrom being its first postmaster.

WILCOX COUNTY

HISTORY

Georgia's 126th county, Wilcox County comprises 380 square miles and was created in 1857 in the central part of the state from Dooly, Irwin, and Pulaski counties. Later, parts of Wilcox County were used to create Turner (1905) and Ben Hill (1906) counties. Historians disagree about the origin of Wilcox County's name, some claiming that it is named after General Mark Willcox, a soldier in the Indian Wars who later served in the Georgia General Assembly, and others believing that it is named for his father, Captain John Willcox. Hernando de Soto is believed to have discovered the Ocmulgee River, in the area that became Wilcox County, in 1540. The area's first inhabitants were Creek Indians who signed treaties in the first two decades of the nineteenth century, forfeiting their land. The first settlers came from neighboring counties and states during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Much of the land was virgin pine forest. Many settlers lived first by subsistence farming and hunting and moved later into cattle ranching after establishing their homesteads. Eventually, settlers produced cotton and fruit, as well as cattle, for the market. The county seat is Abbeville, established in 1858 but not incorporated until 1883. Its location, near the eastern boundary of Wilcox County, was reportedly chosen because David Fitzgerald donated sixty acres there for use as a county seat. A courthouse was built in 1858, and the town subsequently developed around it. In response to complaints that the seat of government was not centrally located, county taxpayers were invited by the state assembly to challenge the eastern location, but no one came forth. The old courthouse remained in use until 1903, when the brick structure that still serves today was completed. A large wild hog population in Abbeville led to its nickname, the "Wild Hog Capital of Georgia," and the town hosts an annual Ocmulgee Wild Hog Festival.

Wilcox County was relatively young when the Civil War (1861-65) began, but its citizens supported the war effort by sending their sons and husbands to fight. Confederate president Jefferson Davis camped on May 8, 1865, at Abbeville during his flight through Wilcox County at the end of the war, two nights before his capture by Union forces in Irwinville.

The Tax Commissioner is an elected Constitutional Officer responsible for every phase of collecting property taxes, from preparation of the digest, billing, accounting and disbursements.

Property taxes include those assessed on real estate, public utilities and ad valorem taxes on motor vehicles and mobile homes. These collections are disbursed to state, county, school and city governing authorities.

As a tag agent for the State of Georgia, the Tax Commissioner is also responsible for the collection of all taxes, fees, and penalties for motor vehicles applicable under the Georgia Code. The Tax Commissioner enforces all regulations mandated by the state.

A large percentage of the revenue realized by the Wilcox County Board of Commissioners and Board of Education is generated from ad valorem taxes collected by the Tax Commissioner. CITY OF PITTS

HISTORY

The community which later became Pitts began as a settlement in the area of the home of L.C. Peebles, two miles east of the Alapaha River. Brock Owens and Ashley J. Pitts operated the first store there in the mid-1880s. Pitts was called Kings' Crossing at the time. When application was made for a post office, the Postmaster General preferred a shorter name. J.A. King suggested the name Pitts, in honor of his son-in-law, Ashley J. Pitts. The name was accepted, and the post office was established on 1 November 1888 with Pitts as postmaster.

The Georgia General Assembly incorporated Pitts as a town in 1905. On April 20, 1921, various people throughout southwest and south-central Georgia observed a meteor trail across the sky which culminated in an explosion and impact at a minimum of four spots slightly north of Pitts. Three fragments of the meteorite were recovered, one falling within a few feet of a child playing outside. It was classified as an iron meteorite. The largest recovered fragment weighed 3.76 kilograms and is currently housed in the Smithsonian Institution Collection. The other fragments remain in private collections. Local accounts and fragments were collected and documented in the Geological Survey of Georgia Bulletin, Issue 29.

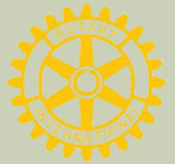

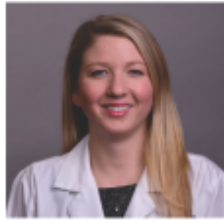

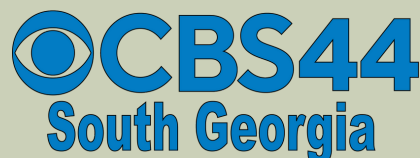

Millage is levied per \$1,000 assessed at 40.607 percent of market value. Ad valorem taxes are due on or before Dec. 20 of each year on property owned as of Jan. 1.

Homestead Exemptions

Homestead exemptions apply to homestead property owned by the taxpayer and occupied as his or her legal residence. To receive the benefit of the homestead exemption, the taxpayer must file an initial application. In Crisp County, the application is filed with the Tax Assessor.

Georgia law allows for the year-round filing of homestead applications but the application must be received by April 1 of the year for which the exemption is first claimed by the taxpayer. Homestead applications received after that date will be applied to the next tax year.

AUTO TAXES

Auto Taxes

The following are state-required taxes, which are collected at the Tax Commissioner's office in the Crisp County Courthouse.

Motor Vehicle Tags: \$20

Motor Vehicle Title Fees: \$18 per vehicle.

Prestige Tags: \$35 manufacturing fee first year, plus \$35 per year per vehicle, in addition to regular fees for their tags.

Wildlife tag \$45.

Tag Transfer Fees: \$5; Personal Property Taxes: Personal property taxes on automobiles are paid at the time of tag renewal (birthdate of individuals and alphabetically for businesses and corporations).

TAVT Taxes: Paid on new or used vehicles at time of purchase. Is applicable to transfers between individuals.

OTHER TAXES

Timber Tax

Timber is taxed only when it is harvested. Taxes are based on 100 percent of the fair market value at the time it is cut, rather than a 40 percent value per year.

Intangible Tax

The intangible recording tax is a state tax that must be placed on a security deed prior to the time it is recorded. Persons who request a security deed be recorded are informed by the Tax Commissioner's Office that they must pay the intangible tax before the deed becomes enforceable. The tax is \$1.50 for each \$500 or part of \$500.

Inventory Tax

All inventories are taxed except when the freeport exemption applies. This exemption applies to goods that are manufactured here for shipment outside of the county, or a distribution center that is simply housing goods being readied for distribution outside the county. Crisp County and the City of Cordele have a 100 percent freeport tax exemption.

Mobile Home Tax

Tax on mobile homes are due and payable on or before May 1. The tax is based on the 40 percent value of the mobile home.
